I will adhere to the highest standards of good citizenship, honesty, and integrity in personal conduct.

I will show courtesy and respect for fellow students, for Coastline travel personnel, chaperones and the director. I will cooperate and honor rules that they set for me such as curfews, punctuality, behavior in airplanes, hotels, busses etc.

I will ensure that I am punctual at all call times.

I will dress and act appropriately at all times and be sensitive to the impression I am conveying in a culture other than my own.

I will show respect for and take reasonable care of school, booster and rental property, including instruments, music and tuxedos.

I will respect the belongings of fellow students. I will not borrow, use, or disturb items belonging to other students without clear prior permission.

I will not use, possess, or distribute alcohol, tobacco, or drugs. I will not possess any medications that are not prescribed to me and have not been cleared by the school administration for my personal use.

I will not engage in any form of sexual harassment, sexual conduct, or conduct with sexual overtones. I understand that at no time and for any reason are boys permitted to be in girl's rooms. I understand that at no time and for any reason are girls permitted to be in boy's rooms.

On the Airplane

Remain in your assigned seat until the pilot has turned off the seat belt sign and Mr. King has given you permission to move.

While in flight, be courteous to other passengers keeping seat switching to a minimum.

Avoid loud conversation and laughter

Your excitement and enthusiasm are completely understandable but must be tempered by the need to respect others. Especially on transatlantic flights, experienced travelers recognize the need for rest - even sleep. Please allow them (and yourself) the chance to do this!

Aboard Busses

Be courteous to your driver

Show your driver that students can be well-behaved, friendly and even helpful. All travelers need to assist with loading and unloading luggage. Keep the noise to a reasonable level and make sure to look out the window. You don't want to miss this once in a lifetime experience! All bus travel will use marching band protocol. At no time are you to embark or disembark without notification or instruction from Mr. King.

Keep the bus clean

Do not leave garbage or litter in seat pockets, ashtrays or on the floor. Use the wastebasket. If you notice someone else's trash, please pick it up and dispose of it.

Keep the Noise down and act responsibly

In the Hotel

Staying in a hotel in a foreign country is quite different from staying in a hotel in the U.S. Many hotels abroad are privately owned. These are ways to be a good ambassador of your own country and leave a great impression behind:

On arrival check your room to make sure all is in order and working

If you notice any damage report it at once to your chaperone.

Respect the other guests

Do not run in the halls, talk loudly, slam doors, turn up the TV volume too loud or behave in a way that disturbs other guests. This is especially important in the evening hours when all hotels expect guests to be quiet to assure the safety and rest of all guests. Failure to meet these standards could result in expulsion from the hotel.

Keep your room neat at all times

Do not scatter your personal belongings about the room. Keep them in your suitcase or in the closet. Hotel maids will be cleaning the rooms daily.

Inspect your room before checking out

It should be clean and orderly; dispose of any trash in the wastebasket. Messy rooms cause extra cleaning bills for which you will be held responsible. Report any damages. Make sure you take all of your belongings.

Do not steal hotel “souvenirs” or eat any food/drinks from a minibar.

A strict accounting is made of towels, linens, keys and min-bar contents. Any attempt to take these items will be both costly and embarrassing. If a room has drinks and snacks, please do not eat or drink. These can be very expensive. We have asked that these not be available to our students...but just in case, don't touch.

Do not leave your room after curfew

At the assigned curfew time, your room will be checked by your chaperone. After room check, its lights out and go to sleep in your assigned room so you are ready for the next day's adventures.
